

What is Open Access?



TRADITIONAL PUBLISHING



Inequitable: Anyone without an institutional subscription must pay to read journal articles

OPEN ACCESS PUBLISHING



More equitable: Anyone who wants to read an open access article can do so for free, whether they are part of an institution or not

What is Green OA?

Rounds of drafting & informal feedback



Preprint
Work in progress
Submitted version

Can always be shared in a green OA repository at any time

Submitted to journal Peer review Author corrections



Postprint
Author-accepted
manuscript (AAM)

Can always be shared in a green OA repository after accepted by journal (sometimes after embargo)

Copy-edited Typeset Formatted



Can usually only be shared if published by a gold OA or hybrid journal Share 'earlier version(s)' of your manuscript in a legal, open repository.

Ensures free online access — no paywalls.

Check journal policies before submitting (e.g., embargoes, versions allowed).

Use tools like <u>Open Policy Finder</u> to verify OA pathways.

Embargo periods may range from 3 to 36 months.

Repository Open Access (Green OA)





Free to deposit – no cost to authors.



Long-term preservation – ensures permanent access, even if journals shut down.



Boosts discoverability – increases exposure and citation potential.



Links to final version – repositories include DOI metadata for easy access.



Equitable model – supports fairer access to publishing.

Publisher Open Access (Gold OA)


Immediately open

Hybrid Journals

- Subscription/pay per view to read
- **Default** is to remain behind paywall
 - Repository (Green) OA applies
- Option to publish OA
 - APC applies (check OA agreement)
 - Green OA for MBIE

WHAT ARE OPEN ACCESS AGREEMENTS?

Open access agreements are between institutions and publishers and allow authors to publish articles open access without incurring article processing charges (APCs).

Open Access publishing agreements

Find out about Open Access agreements between the University and scholarly publishers, including an A-Z list of all journals included in these agreements.

Waipapa Taumata Rau | University of Auckland has access to 21 Open Access publishing agreements in 2025 where authors can publish in Open Access journals without paying the article processing charge, or APC (see *Publishing agreements - no author-incurred APCs* below). We also have 6 agreements where publication is discounted as opposed to fully covered (see *Publishing discounts - author-incurred charges apply* below).

Publishing agreements - no author-incurred APCs

You can access a full A-Z list for all journals covered by our 2025 Open Access Publishing Agreements. Make sure you select 'University of Auckland' to filter to the agreements applicable to our institution. You can filter by publisher or use the search button to find specific journals.

2025 Alphabetical title list

The list of journals covered by open access publishing agreements in 2025. This list is updated on an ongoing basis during the year. You'll need to: Select your institution and tick "University of Auckland."

HOW TO USE THE OPEN ACCESS AGREEMENTS

The corresponding author must be from the University of Auckland.

You must use your University of Auckland staff email address (name@auckland.ac.nz) when submitting your article.

Select the Open Access publication option within the publisher's submission platform.

Select which Creative Commons license you want attributed to your article. (See the ResearchHub for more info on CC licenses.)

Creative Commons licensing enables you to share your work openly while determining what permissions you give others to use your work.
